 - Current enrollment is 3,066 students. The number is high because of our specific program offerings. Each teacher is allocated 150 students. All students who live in CPS and pass the exam are guaranteed a place up through the March registration date.

 - Student Support Center Update
 - Counselor's Field Trip approved, including Senior Forum
 - 2018-19 Budget reviewed
 - Concerns:
 - Overloads: Teacher Allocation Committee (TAC) October (Contractual limit is 150 students per teacher. In general teachers have 151-152 students.)
 - English 10, science, and social studies have sections over 150.
 - Classes will need to be balanced.
 - English 10 will add 3 sections and hire a teacher at .6
 - Schedule E budget reviewed and discussed
 - Teacher Safe Schools Training
 - Optioning through PowerSchool
