- 2. Later School Start Time (Jilda Vargas- Adams and Dean Beebe)
 - a. Board of Education passed proposal to every CPS High School student to start at 8:30 AM or later with a three year transition plan, specifically to address transportation. Board members meet tomorrow with the Superintendent to determine the administration's stance. As far as next year, not sure what is happening yet.
 - b. WHHS start time will be pushed back to 7:45 AM (per Mr. Chambers as stated on CPS website), all high schools who start before 8:30 AM have been adjusted somehow.
 - c. CPS is looking at optimizing the routing for the Metro bus service.
 - d. Melanie Bates and Carolyn Jones voted no against the proposal (board members).
 - e. Z. Williams expresses concern about extracurriculars and athletic schedules. Stith Deck asks Vargas-Adams what her goal for our committee was.
 - f. Vargas-Adams said she would hope there would be a letter drafted from the LSDMC supporting the decision.
 - g. Committee was not prepared to support this without discussion. Due to full agenda, Stith Deck and Chambers table the discussion and letter writing for the agenda for the next meeting.

- a. Mental Health Update
 - i. J. Chambers additional GCBH therapist working 2 days a week until she builds up case load. Three full time and one part time. She currently has a list of 15 families she will be servicing. Space is still an issue. Some parents have brought up the issue of including dental/vision in the building.
 - ii. This building is not a Community Learning Center and this proposal was not included in the renovation.
 - iii. Working towards including a wellness tab on the website and information in newsletter.
 - iv. Stith Deck brought up State of the School address, and parent concerns that were voiced during that meeting.

- v. Chambers hopes parents understand what resources are available, and also that we need to take the pressure off of students (multiple AP course, Honors etc.).
- vi. S. Nelson interested in determining how parents can get more informed regarding this idea.
- vii. Z. Williams states that student group met and discussed informing parents at Orientation.
- viii. J. Chambers we need to determine limitations.
