WHHS Fencer Competes at Nationals

The Alumni Foundation helped fill the gap for one of our Juniors, Jan Jacek Biesiada, to attend the USA National Championships held in July in Phoenix.

Jan competed in the Junior Men's Foil, Div. 2 Men's Foil and Div. 3 Men's Foil. To qualify, Jan had to compete in several regional tournaments and earn qualification points. He has also competed in St. Louis and Chicago and trains every weekend at the Louisville Fencing Center.

In addition to being a fencer, he recently passed the referee exam and after a year of refereeing he qualified to referee at regional tournaments. He hopes to attend Ohio State University and follow the footsteps of Donald Anthony Jr '75, Head Coach of the OSU Fencing Team. (After graduation, Donald Anthony went on to fence for Princeton University, competed in multiple

World Championships and North American Cups and earned multiple medals. He has also served as the Chairman of the United States Fencing Association.)

Jan is also an excellent student. He immigrated from Poland in 2008 and became a US Citizen in 2021. He has maintained his Polish literacy and sat for the Ohio Biliteracy Exam in Polish.

Annual Cardboard Regatta

Who knew when our alumni-funded natatorium was on the drawing boards that it would be the future site of an AP Physics 2 Annual Cardboard Regatta competition?

The inaugural event began in 2021 and has evolved into an annual tradition. Students in AP Physics 2 are given two sheets of cardboard and two rolls of duct tape. They must design a boat that will transport two of the team members across the pool. The lab is part of our fluid mechanics unit on buoyancy. We follow all the standard engineering practices including building and testing a prototype, submitting a materials utilization plan, a detailed set of calculations and finally the performance test.

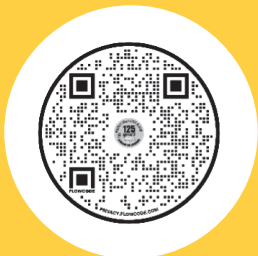

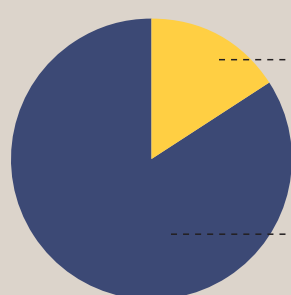
